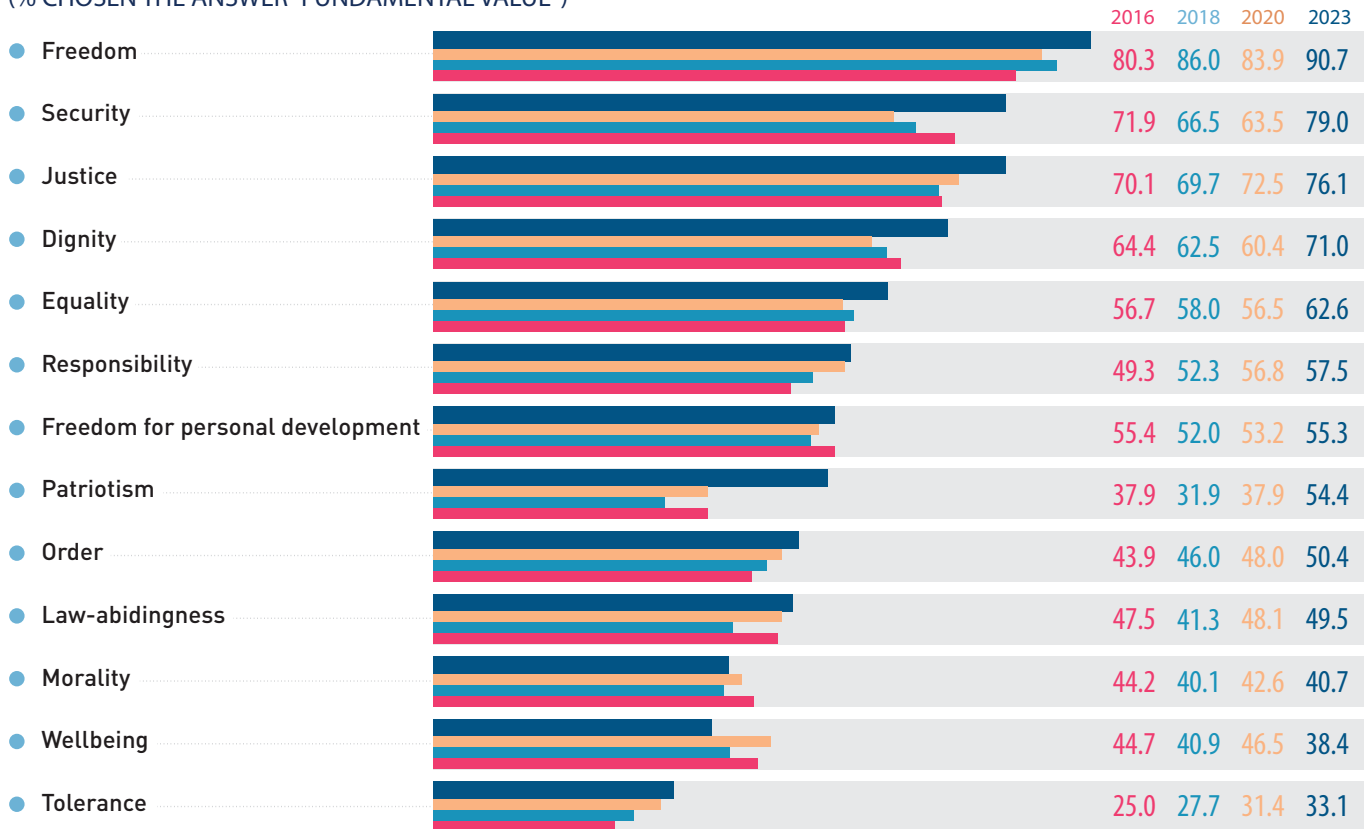

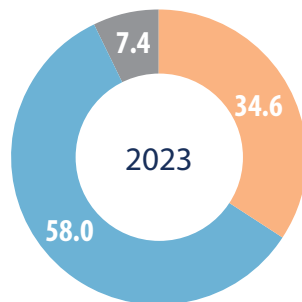

(% CHOSEN THE ANSWER "FUNDAMENTAL VALUE")

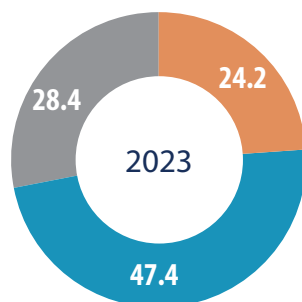


### STATE OR PERSON IS FULLY RESPONSIBLE?

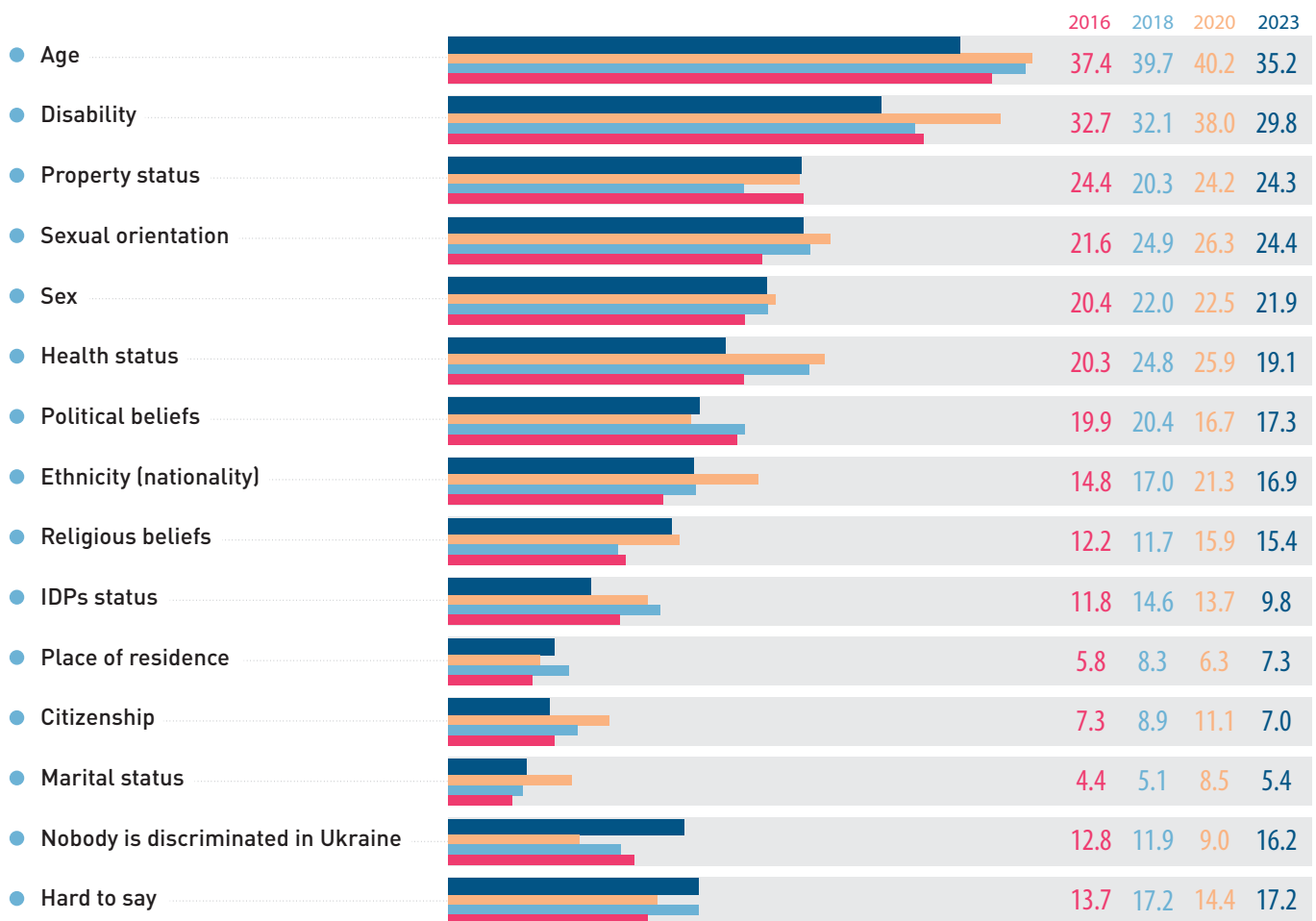

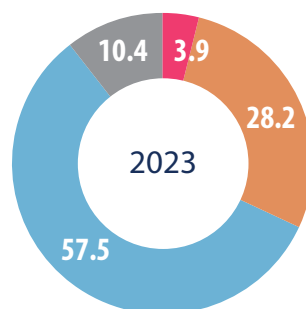
# WHETHER DISCRIMINATION ISSUES ARE SIGNIFICANT IN UKRAINE

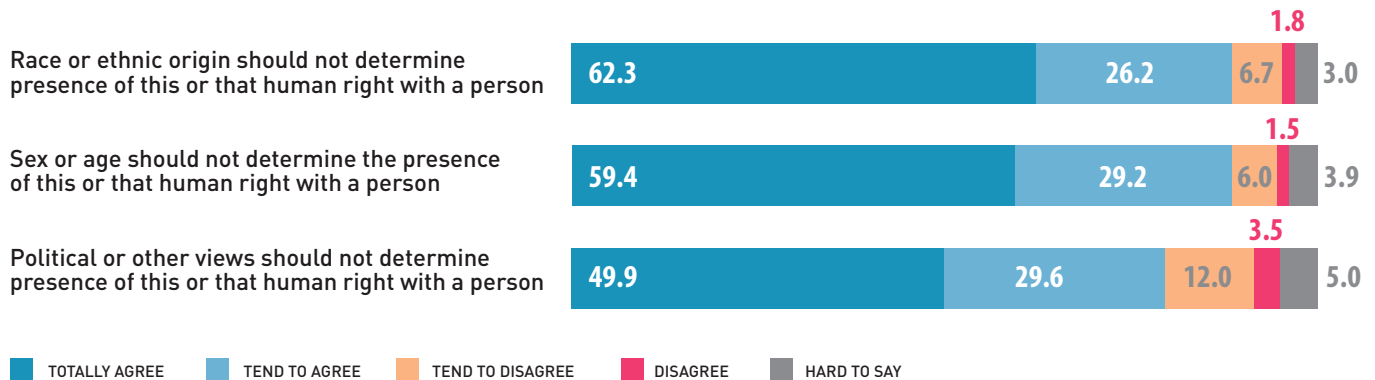

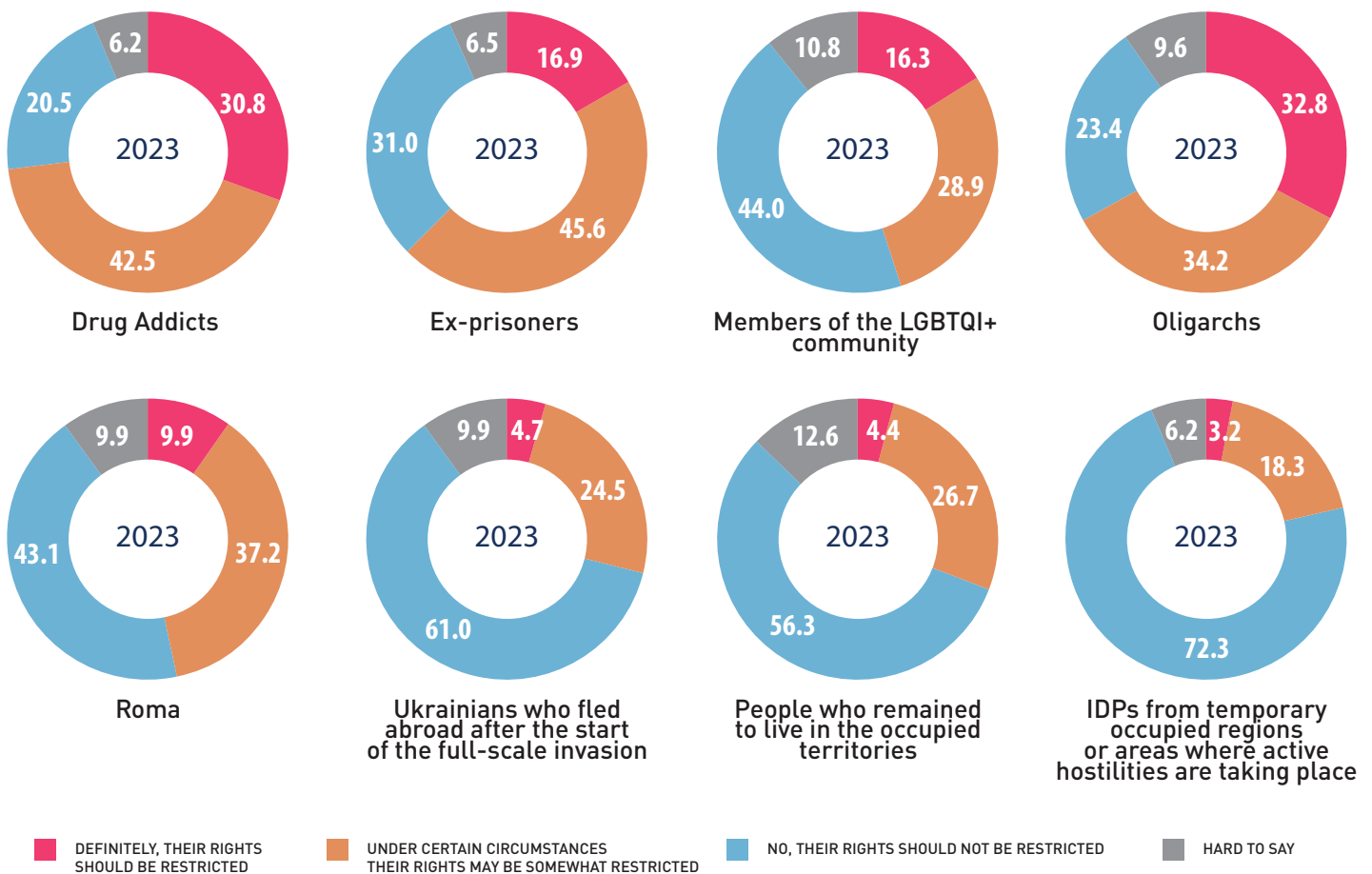

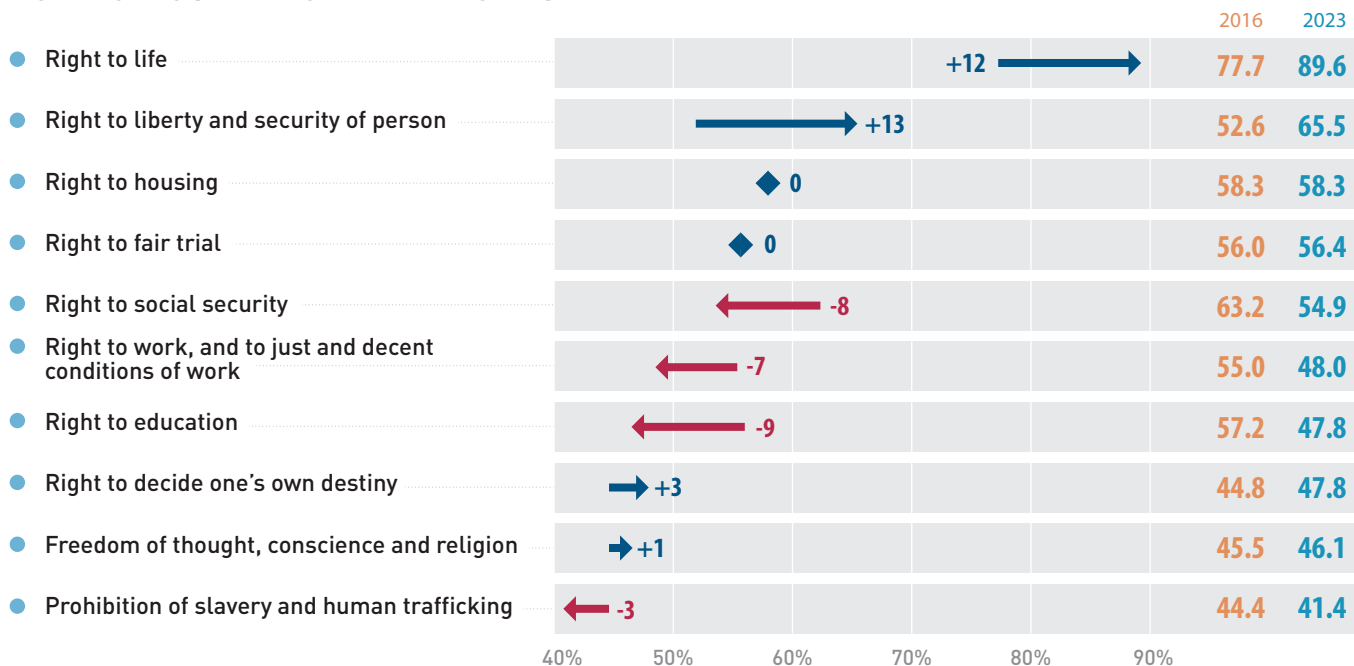
## ATTITUDE TO THE POSSIBILITY OF RESTRICTING THE RIGHTS OF CERTAIN SOCIAL GROUPS (%)



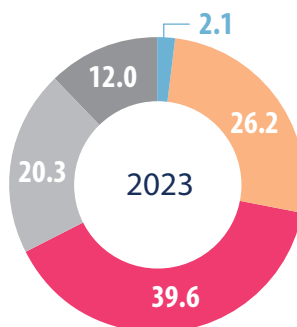

## EVALUATION OF THE SITUATION WITH OBSERVANCE OF VARIOUS RIGHTS

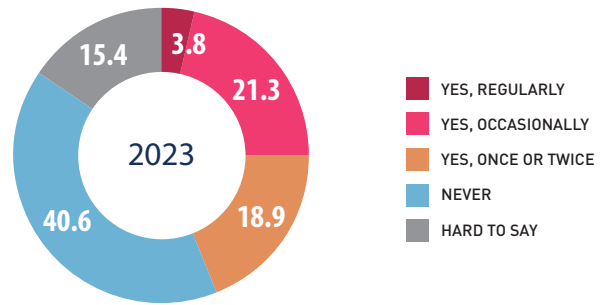
Average value on a five-point scale, with 1 for extremely poor observance of a right, and 5 for full observance.



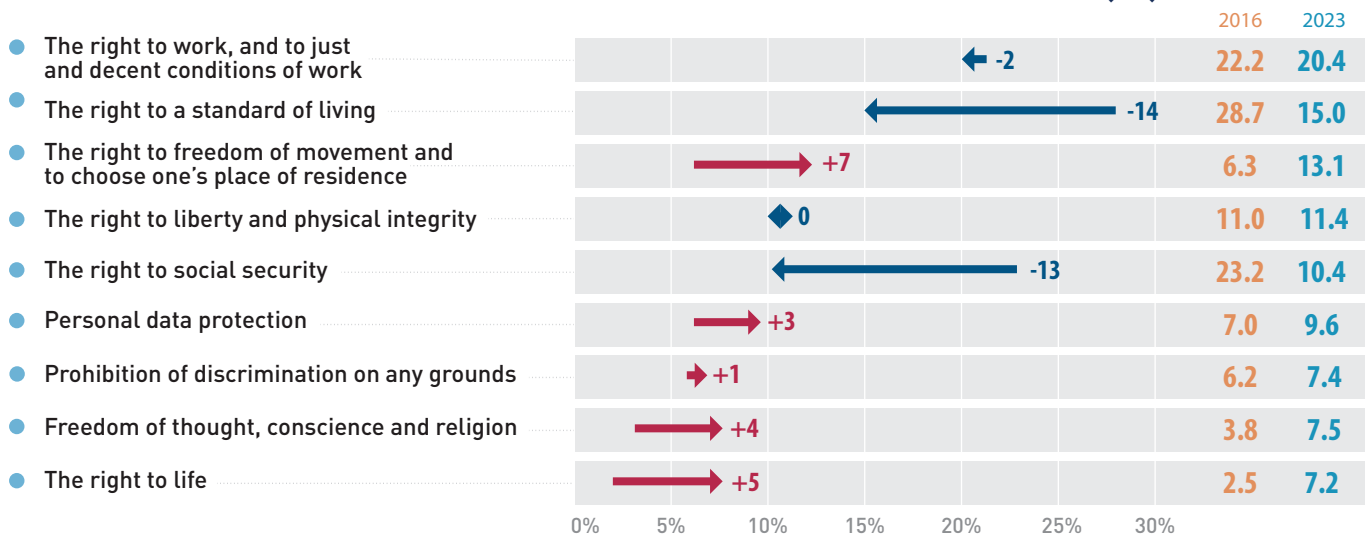

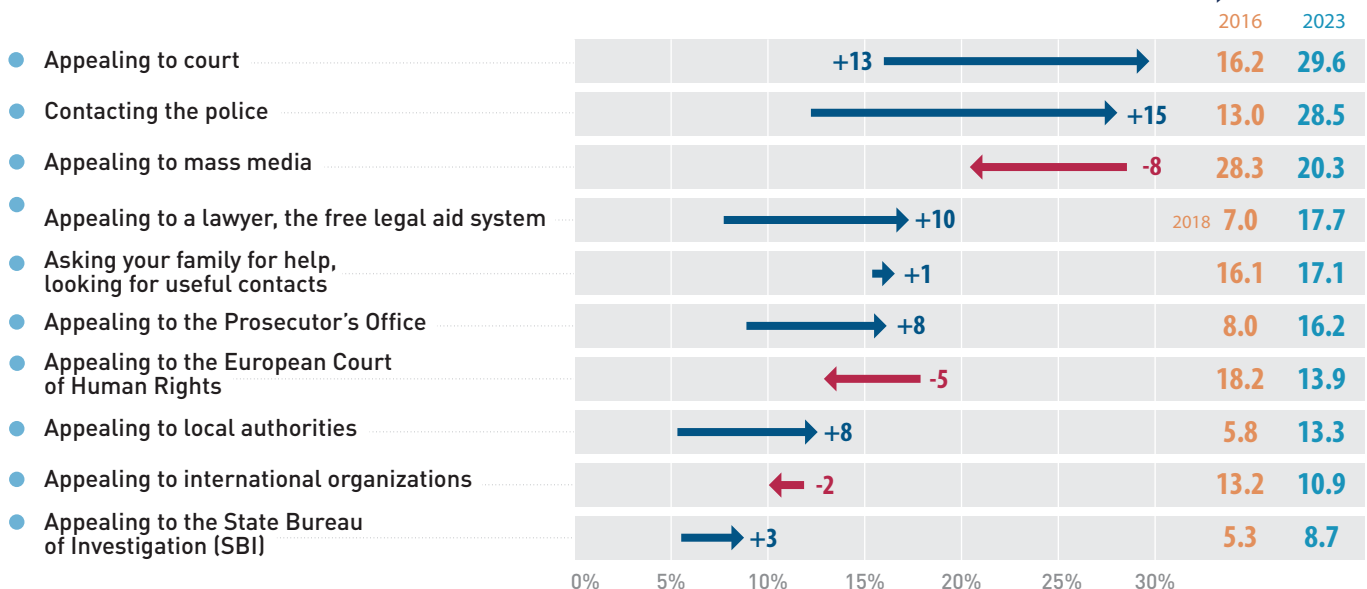

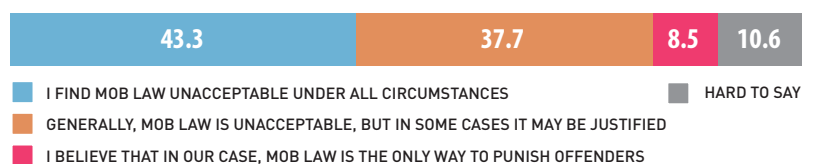
## WHICH RIGHTS HAVE BEEN VIOLATED IN THE LAST TWO YEARS? (%)



## TOP 10 MOST EFFECTIVE MECHANISMS FOR STANDING UP FOR RIGHTS, %



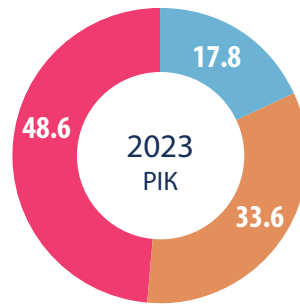
## VIEWS ON ENCOURAGING ADMINISTERING OF JUSTICE BY PEOPLE THEMSELVES (%)

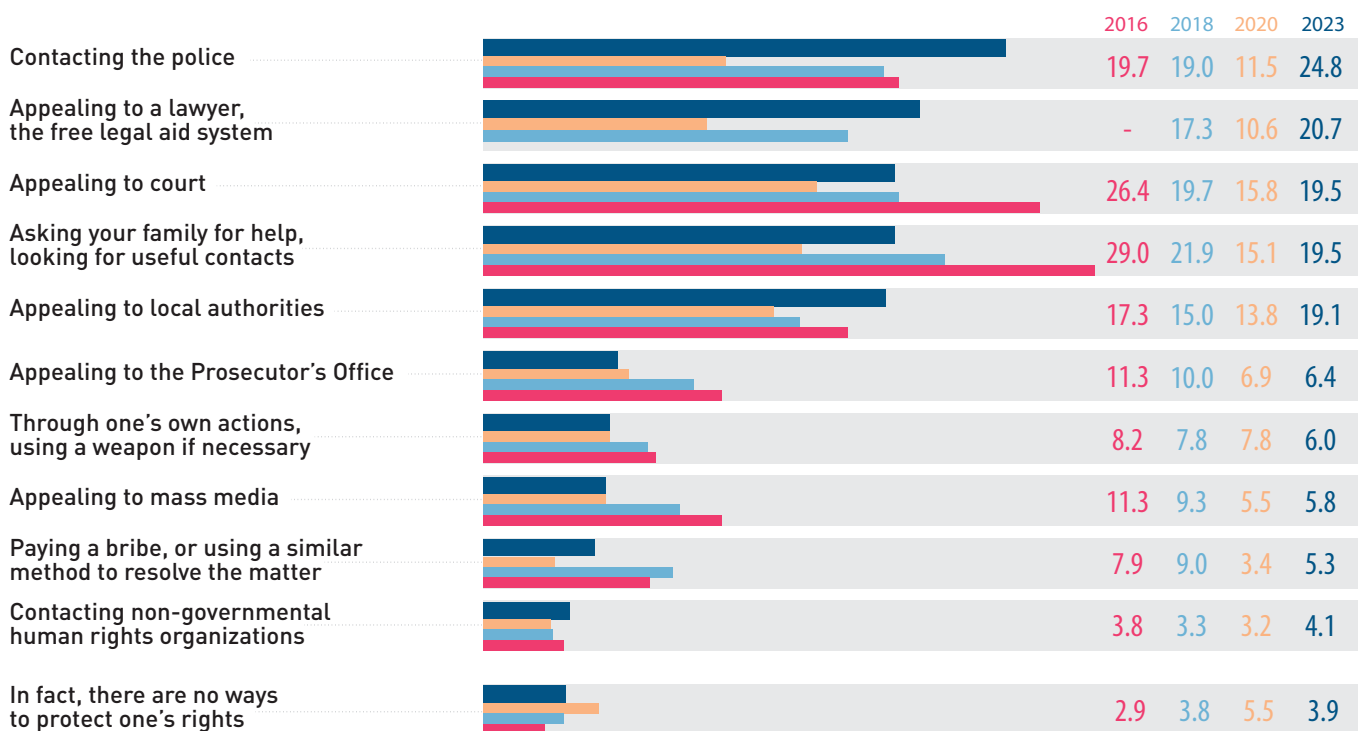

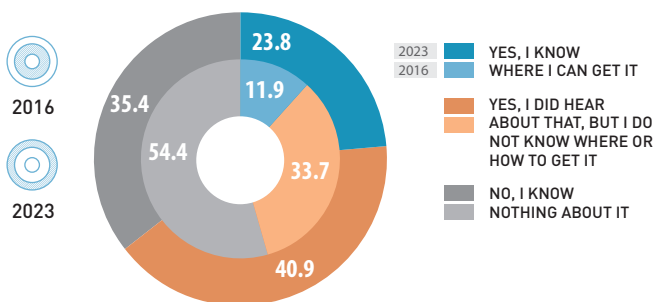

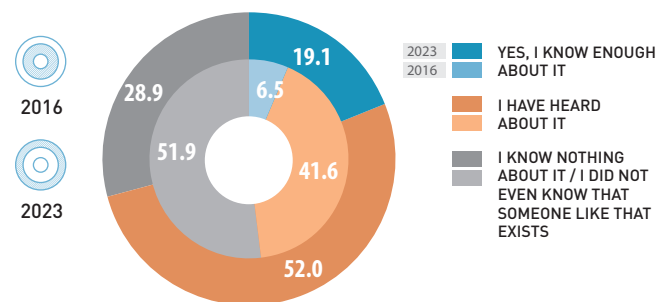
IF YOU TRIED TO PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS, WHICH MEANS DID YOU USE? TOP 10



DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY TO RECEIVE FREE LEGAL AID FROM THE STATE? (%)



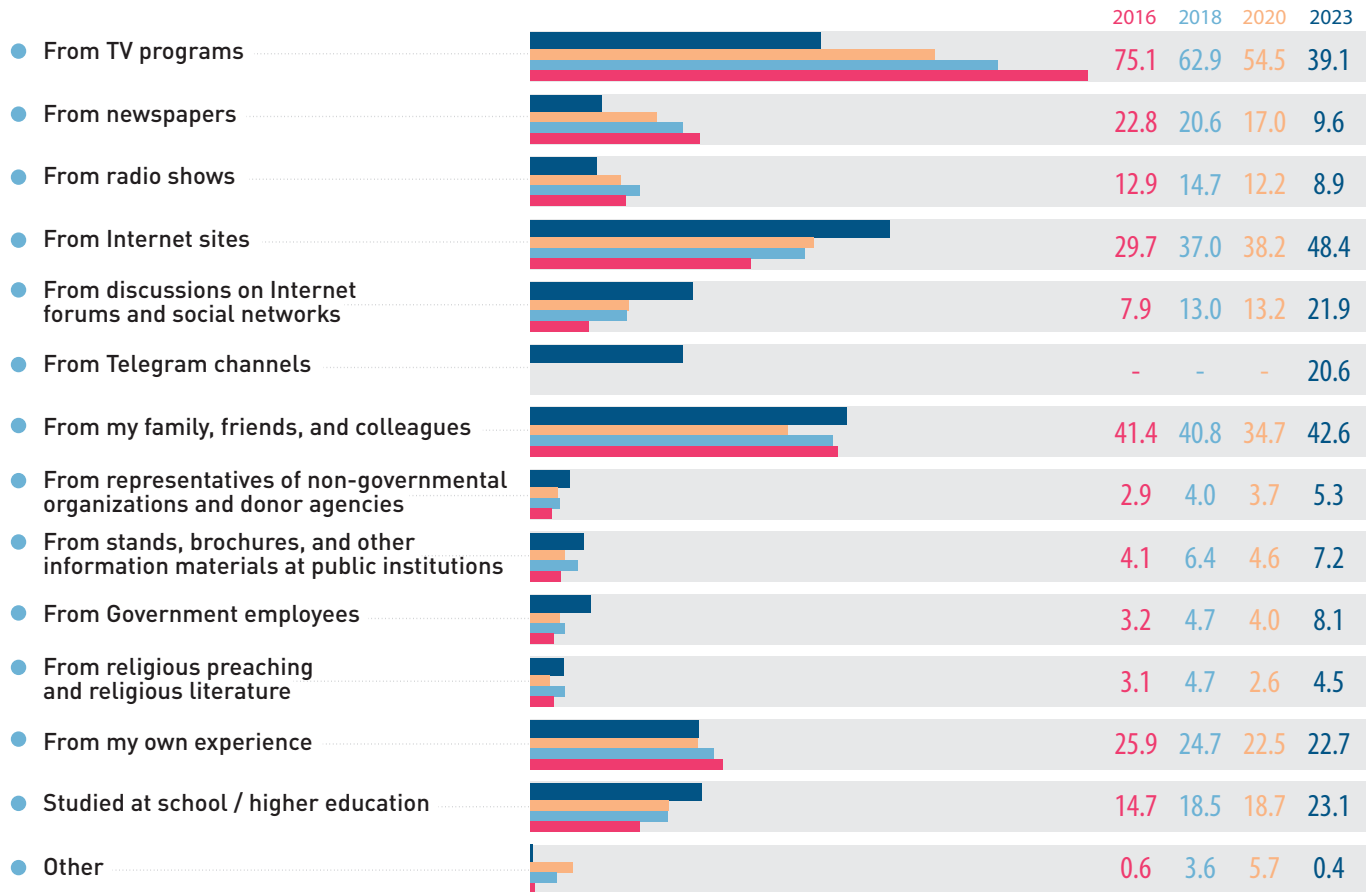

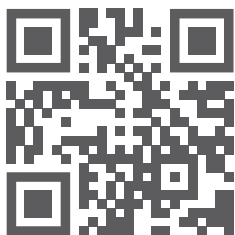

The nationwide survey on human rights in Ukraine was conducted by Ilko Kucheriv Democratic Initiatives Foundation together with the Centre for Political Sociology, UNDP in Ukraine and ZMINA Human Rights Centre in a period from 29 October till 12 November 2023. A total of 2,001 respondents aged 18 and older were interviewed. The maximum random sampling error does not exceed 2.3%. In addition, the systematic bias due to the forced migration of millions of citizens caused by the full-scale war in Ukraine should be taken into account. This is the fourth round of survey called "What Ukrainians Know and Think of Human Rights?". The results of the surveys conducted in 2016, 2018 and 2020 can be found here.
